


Scholarship Awards Night

The Shiawassee Community Foundation hosted its Scholarship Awards Night on Sunday, April 27, at the Owosso Performing Arts Center.

What is YAC?



The Youth Advisory Council (YAC) is giving high school students in Shiawassee County a unique opportunity to make a real difference in their community. YAC empowers young people to lead through service, philanthropy, and grantmaking, all while learning what it takes to build a stronger, more connected community.

Throughout the year, YAC members volunteer their time at a wide range of local events, but YAC is more than just volunteering. Members also plan and support charitable projects designed to meet real needs in the community.

One of the most impactful roles YAC members play is in grantmaking. Each year, the group reviews grant applications and makes funding recommendations for youth-focused projects supported by the W.K. Kellogg Fund. These recommendations are then reviewed and approved by the Foundation's Board of Directors, giving students a hands-on experience in philanthropic decision-making and a deeper understanding of the needs facing their peers.

By participating in YAC, students gain far more than volunteer hours. They build leadership skills, connect with local nonprofits, and develop a greater awareness of the challenges and opportunities within their own communities. For students who are passionate about service and want to make a lasting impact, joining YAC is a meaningful way to get involved.

What Is an Endowment, and Why Does It Matter?

An endowment is a fund that's invested to grow over time, while still providing ongoing support to the causes or scholarships it was created for. Think of it like planting a tree: the seed you plant today will bear fruit year after year—supporting students, nonprofits, and community programs forever.

Here's how it works:

- Your gift is invested by the Foundation.
- Each year, a portion of the fund's earnings is granted to support your chosen cause.
- The original gift stays intact, growing over time to increase future impact.

This means your legacy lives on, generation after generation.
